

The idea of 'Thin Places' is often applied to places where there is a sense of something that transcends the everyday world.

To think about:-

whatever it is that might have made a place significant spiritual/emotional

what has been before us is still with us spatial/physical the way time passes walking in footsteps layers and marks keep in touch with the feeling of the place

temporal/ephemeral a sense that time is suspended

Annie's work is based around her interest in landscape, history, archaeology and myths. The exhibition 'Walking In Thin Place' showed abstract paintings which evolved from time spent at Julian's Bower medieval turf maze - Alkborough, North Lincolnshire. The turf maze and the landscape around it have a special, timeless atmosphere. The convergence of three rivers add to the feeling that this place has been important to our ancestors for hundreds of years.

PHYGITAL PHONICS 3.

For Phygital Phonics 3 we are collecting sounds of thin places. Annie Luke Turner has made work in response to walking in thin places. See drawing prompts below and turn over for more info.

- use your non dominant hand to draw.

- switch drawing materials - carry a selection of - pencils, felt tips, charcoal, graphite.

- make a drawing where you don't lift the pencil off the paper.

- make a drawing where you do not look at the paper, just look at the landscape in front of you.

- close your eyes and listen, make a drawing where you interpret the sounds you hear with marks.

- if you are not happy with a drawing, cover it with masking tape and draw again on top.



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
